The Tongan and the Hispanic communities were accepting of each other but did not trust much and part of the blame can be caused by miscommunication, though both have the same family values and desire to progress, the death of Tonga's Prince Tu'ipelehake, his wife, Princess Kaimana, and their driver, Vinisia Hefa, earlier this month in Menlo Park has pushed an issue all adults in Northern California had in mind, kids should not be given a driver's license at 18, when and if approved, the driving age must be 21 or older.

The royal couple and Hefa died July 5 when their vehicle was hit by a Ford Mustang apparently racing a black Cadillac on Highway 101, this mystery vehicle and its driver remain in the shadows, the details of the accident is also ignored by all of us, seems like "the mafia" or "la cosa nuestra" has forced people to keep their mouths and ears shut, I am beginning to think that there was a conspiracy to kill the royal couple since their trip had purposes to indoctrinate Tongan communities to consider political reforms in their homeland, the vast members of this community live here in Northern California.

Therefore I pray that you can, through your newspaper, ask my neighbors to help solve this unfortunate case of misunderstanding, we need our communities to remain friends, we need our hearts to heal the pain and the sorrow the Delgado family is suffering now and in September, after the investigations finally shed the light to this case, a young woman will be charged with involuntary manslaughter which will probably be a lesser sentence and therefore, the time she will spend in jail can be spent learning a career that will lead her to be a better person, perhaps law or international human relations.
